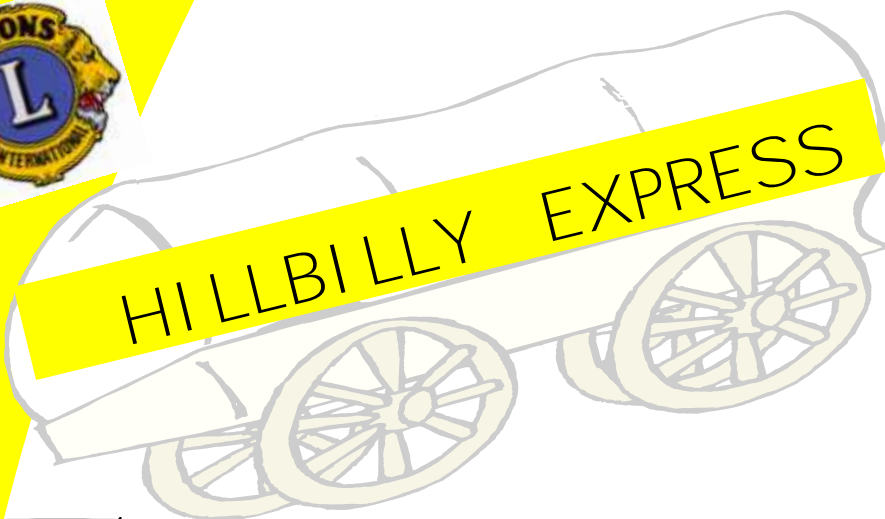

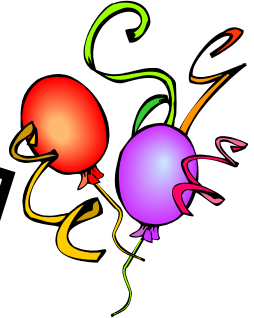

50/50 Raffle = \$52.00 - Tail Twister = \$ 16.00 - CCI = \$5.00

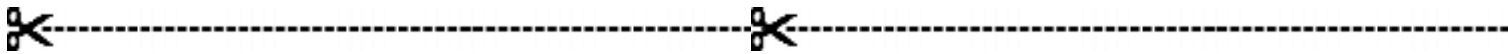

Meet your fellow Lion Chris Beermann:

I was born a poor black child... Sorry, that was Steve Martin in The Jerk!! I was born to James and Audrey in Zion, Illinois (You are wondering! Where is that?). Zion is a small town North of Chicago on the Illinois/Wisconsin border on the shores of Lake Michigan. Most of my family still lives there. When I was ten, my Dad got a job in L.A. and moved his small family to Canyon Country, Ca. Boy, did I stick out like a sore thumb in the mid-1970's of Southern Cal as a rural mid-western girl. I met my best friend Patricia in the 5th grade and we are still friends today, she lives in Florida. My two brothers were born when I was 12 and 14 years old, and I was present at both of their births. My parents were going through a naturalist kick at the time, vegetarians, home births and all.

I stayed in Canyon Country until I joined the USAF in 1984. After a short stay at Lackland AFB, Texas and a longer stay in Keesler AFB, Mississippi, I was assigned to Lindsay Air Station, in Wiesbaden, Germany as a Wideband Maintenance Tech. I met my first husband there and we were married a year later. I was then transferred to Travis AFB, Fairfield, Ca working as a Satellite/Wideband Maintenance Tech. My husband and I became proud parents of our daughter, Heather. Unfortunately, my Grandmother died the day my daughter was due, in Mar, 1989. Heather was born 4 days later. Grandma Rooks pretty much raised me while my parents were working and going to college. Despite our recent loss, we enjoyed our beautiful and wonderful daughter. She has grown into a wonderful woman of 22 and made me a proud Grandma in 2010.

I switched from Active Duty in 1990 to Air National Guard, based out of Hayward. I decided to hang up the military life in 1992. I had started working for Xerox in August, 1992 and found it difficult to do that and the military at the same time. It was a very time demanding job, with long commutes to San Francisco, Berkeley, Walnut Creek, Oakland, and Fremont. My son, Justin, came along in July, 1994. After five years, I felt ready to go back in the military and rejoined the Air National Guard in 1997, the same unit that I had left in 1992. I deployed to Saudi Arabia (2000) and United Arab Emirates (2005). In early 1998, my husband and I started divorce proceedings. Sean Beermann found out about my pending divorce and immediately started pursuing my affections. It worked, we got married in late 1999 and moved to Lathrop, Ca, my job was in the Modesto/Stockton area. About a year later, Sean and I moved to Copperopolis, near Angels Camp. We lived there for about 5 years, until our Guard unit changed missions and moved from Hayward to Beale AFB. I chose to cross train into Imagery Analysis and moved with the Unit. I went to Tech School in Nov, 2004 and moved to Marysville in May, 2005. After I finished my post-school training, I started working for Xerox covering Yuba City, Marysville, Grass Valley, and Sacramento. Sean was still living in Copperopolis prepping our old house for sale, so we could find a house in this area, I commuted home on weekends. We found a house in Browns Valley, in Oct 2005. Unfortunately, while we were in the purchasing process, my father fell ill, and I rushed to Seattle. Our new house closed in Oct, 2005, the same day my father died. As a result of his death, I moved my brother to Marysville, and took over his care. He is disabled and unable to fully care for himself. My mother sold her house in Seattle and followed my brother a couple years later, they now live in Forbestown.

Not long after we moved to Browns Valley, Sean was accepted as an Air Guard Tech and started working at Beale AFB. In 2007, I was involuntarily activated for two years, which ended up being two and a half years in uniform. I was then approached about a contractor job in 2009, which I accepted and am still doing today. Sean was hired on as a DOD civilian in late 2010. We met Hank Juska in our travels around Browns Valley and he convinced us to join the Lion's Club, in trade he joined Sean as a Clamper. Hank was a great friend and we both miss him.

But you all know the rest of the story, it has been a little over two years in the Foothill Loma Rica Lions club. We live quietly with five cats, three dogs, some chickens and two donkeys (quietly, right!!). And, of course, my almost 17 year old son, who goes to Marysville High. We both ride motorcycles, starting with a couple of Sportsters, but have since upgraded. I now have a Road King and can't wait for better weather. I can't think of anything really interesting to tell you all. It has been a pretty average life so far: work, sleep, eat repeat!!

SUNGLASS SENSE

Dr. Duffner member of the American Academy of Ophthalmology says it **doesn't matter if your sunglasses are \$500 or \$25**, nor what color or how dark a pair are as long as they give close to 100 percent protection from both UVA and UVB rays.
