Recipe requested—from Lioness LaVera Fruit Cocktail Cake

Mix and Set Aside—2 C Flour, 2 Tsp Baking Soda, 1/2 Tsp Salt

Beat 2 Eggs, Gradually add 1½ C Sugar, beating until fluffy. Add dry ingredients alternately with 1 Can of Fruit Cocktail (undrained). Mix until smooth. Pour into greased 13x9 pan.

Combine 1/4 C Brown Sugar and 1/4 C Chopped Nuts, Mix well, and sprinkle over top of Cake.

Bake 350° for 30-35 minutes

While warm add topping below:

Combine in saucepan—1/2 C Evaporated Milk, 1/4 C Margarine, 3/4 C Sugar

Cook to full boil and slightly thickened. Remove from fire and add 1 C Chopped Nuts and 1 Tsp Vanilla, Mix well and spread over cake. Enjoy.
