### DON'T PANIC

**I know that's what the experts say and I also know it's hard to do** now that stocks and mutual funds have been socked again; but resist selling and let this cycle run its course.

One thing certain is that stocks fall apart with regularity, and then recover. Over the past 110 years, investors have lived through severe drops more than one-third of the time.

The bond market tells a different story. Since the 1960s, bonds and bond funds have gained tremendously in value.

**If you're 30-40** you can probably load up on stocks and be ok in **30 years, but if you're already 50-60** and will be depending on your retirement to help pay your bills you need to be more conservative with your money. It is suggested that as little as 25% of your money be invested in stocks and the rest in diversified, high quality fixed-income vehicles such as bonds, bond funds and insured **bank CD's. Hang in there, the market WILL climb back up.**
